



Plumbers, gasfitters and drainlayers do the following work:


- measure, cut and shape pipes.
- install, join, and seal pipes and fittings.
- install and maintain hot water and heating systems, such as hot water tanks, solar water heaters, central heating, gas heaters, heat pumps, underfloor heating, and wood burners.
- lay or repair drains, and get consents from local councils to do the work.
- install and repair roofing pipes and spouting.
- replace or repair damaged or blocked water, sewerage, and gas pipes.
- install fixtures in kitchens, bathrooms, and laundries.
- supervise, or run their own business.

As an apprentice, you will learn:

- plumbing, gas and drainage materials and methods.
- safe, correct use of tools and how to maintain them.
- how to follow designs, plans and instructions.
- · soldering and welding skills.
- good trade practice, including ensuring work complies with industry standards.
- building and safety regulations.
- the Building Code in relation to plumbing, gas, and drainage.

Mentoring

Your Masterlink mentor/Regional Manager will regularly meet with you and your host business throughout your apprenticeship. These check-ins ensure all is going well and your studies are on track.

Logistics managed

Your block course training, travel and accommodation are organised by Masterlink.

Your essential skills

What does it take to be a successful apprentice?

The right attitude is top of the list!

From Day One, you need to be:

- keen to learn new things and open to new experiences.
- motivated to succeed, and committed to completing the apprenticeship.
- a hands-on hard worker, who loves problem-solving and thrives on variety.
- a great communicator, who listens and asks questions.
- able to work independently, or in a team.
- organised, punctual, and able to follow instructions.
- practical and safety-conscious, with an eye for detail.
- fit to carry out physical work, sometimes in challenging environments.
- computer literate to complete your online training.

Mandatory requirements

- New Zealand Citizenship or Permanent Residency.
- Proof of your commitment. This includes practical experience either:
 - working on construction sites, outdoors on farms or orchards, in the wider plumbing industry, or
 - Gateway or other trade work experience, including relevant holiday jobs if you are applying straight from school.
- A good level of numeracy and literacy skills.
- Good references.

Good to have:

- A driver licence.
- NCEA Level 1, 2 or 3 results (especially in English, Maths, Science, or Technology).

Masterlink apprentice applicants are screened for criminal convictions and driving offences. These are assessed on a case-by-case basis. Applicants must also pass a medical check that includes alcohol and drug testing.

Pre-trade courses

Before you start an apprenticeship, you are not required to complete a Level 3 pre-trade course.

Completing a pre-trade course does not automatically guarantee you an apprenticeship. We suggest you apply to us before you sign up for a course. We will assess your suitability to our trades.

Frequently asked questions

What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is the only way to learn the plumbing, drainlaying and/or qasfitting trades.

Apprentices learn through a combination of:

- on-job practical experience (working on real jobsites with qualified tradespeople), and
- off-job theory study (online and in the classroom).

Apprentices must complete all their course modules (on-job and off-job) and reach levels of competency to attain their New Zealand Certificate — a Level 4 NZQA recognised qualification.

What our learners do after completing their apprenticeship is their choice!

How long does it take to complete an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship requires years of training. The exact time it takes depends on the effort the apprentice puts into completing their studies.

Apprenticeships generally take:

- Drainlaying only = 2 years
- Plumbing & Drainlaying = 4 years
- Plumbing, Drainlaying & Gasfitting = 5 years

Masterlink apprentices generally complete their qualifications well within these timeframes.

How much will I earn as a Masterlink apprentice?

You are paid more than the minimum Training Wage (set by the NZ government) through Masterlink. Our host businesses decide how much an apprentice is paid based on their experience, and their value to the business.

We work to secure fair rates for Masterlink apprentices, and wages usually increase every 12 months as experience builds and skills are gained.

It is important to remember that you are being paid to learn. Do the mahi in your apprenticeship and you will reap the rewards on your career journey.

How much does a Masterlink apprenticeship cost?

There is an upfront payment to Masterlink to go towards the initial costs of starting an apprenticeship. Training fees may also apply. Visit www.masterlink.co.nz for the latest information.

We are open to discussions about financial assistance, which is decided on a case-by-case basis. Masterlink scholarships and awards are also available to support apprentice learning.

What are the advantages of training through Masterlink?

Support! The Masterlink Team is a phone call or email away.

- Practical support includes overseeing training, scheduling block courses at local training providers, and arranging travel and accommodation (if you have to travel out of town to attend block course).
- We pay wages from day one of the apprenticeship, and manage all employment details including PAYE, ACC, and HR.
- Masterlink Regional Managers provide mentoring to our apprentices, which is supported by free Masterlink Training and our exclusive Wellbeing programme.
- Our Regional Managers do regular check-ins with apprentices and hosts.
 A lot can happen over the years of an apprenticeship. If something unexpected happens, Masterlink works to get the best outcome for everyone involved.
- We keep everyone updated with the latest industry news and available government funding.
